Define Problem Precisely

Radiological materials are currently subject to no transport limitations, assuming size and weight restrictions under Wis. Stat. Ch. 348 are complied with. As part of Wisconsin's radiological emergency preparedness management, certain radiological materials should be transported only with State Patrol escort.

Description of Proposed Change

Create a requirement in Wis. Stat. 348.10 that requires a carrier to secure State Patrol escort, for travel on all Wisconsin roadways, for a "highway route controlled quantity" of radiological materials, as defined under 49 CFR 173.403

Justification for Change

Transport of radiological materials on Wisconsin roadways is increasing. In the event of an incident involving a vehicle transporting these materials, a State Patrol escort would facilitate rapid response and incident management. This requirement would proposal would be part of a statewide larger radiological emergency preparedness

Presumably DOT would also be authorized to attach other conditions. Is there anything additional you would like to specify? Also, please note, the fee in this provision is attached to the permit, not specifically the escort, and the fee would presumably be directed to the transportation fund, not to a special traffic enforcement appropriation. Please let me know if you want any changes.

Hello –

- 1) Regarding the cross-reference to 49 CFR 173.403, that does meet our intent.
- 2) The penalty for a violation is under s. 348.11, Stats., not s. 349.11, Stats., as indicated in the notes. The penalties of not less than \$10 nor more than \$200 are too low. See the attached document for what may be an appropriate penalty. Penalties similar to those for Group 3 interstate and intrastate hazardous materials violations under ch. Trans 326 in the 2015 State of Wisconsin Revised State Traffic Deposit Schedule are more appropriate. Higher penalties are requested commensurate with the health hazards and risks associated with radiological materials. The transport of radiological materials if not done properly could have widespread health effects. The current range for interstate and intrastate hazardous materials violations is \$30-300, but we should be looking at \$200 as a minimum for radiological materials.
- 3) Having fee provisions similar to both single-trip permits as under s. 348.26 and multiple-trip permits under s. 348.27 would be a good idea. A key difference is that we would like the authority to specify routes on multiple-use permits, whereas multiple-use permits for the transport of hazardous materials currently are not route-specific. We need a provision that the department can specify routes because we will be locking them into a route with an escort. We will be communicating this route to emergency management administrators. Single-trip permits are already route-specific.
- 4) We would like a delayed effective date of 90 days after enactment.

20 than \$200 nor more than \$500.
