Hi Mike,

I talked to Matt and this was a suggestion. Would this be doable?

I would suggest maybe allowing DSPS to charge the fees by a calendar year quarter – which would create some structure for them to inform applicants of how much they need to pay based upon when they submit their application. A pure prorate would also be a bookkeeping nightmare for DSPS. So, if a license is good for two years, allow DSPS to break up the two years into 8 quarters and applicants can pay based upon which quarter they apply in – if they are only a quarter away from the regular payment date, they would only pay 1/8<sup>th</sup> of the fee.

#### Brooke,

As I was taking a look at the statutes regarding your request to have fees be prorated, I thought at first that the request was very simple. But then I realized that, when you apply for a license, part of your application is paying the fee. So DSPS would need some way of telling people up front what the prorated fee would be, which might be difficult especially since you wouldn't know when DSPS will issue your license. You also have people who might apply for a license, only to be denied for whatever reason. In that case, it appears from reading DSPS's rules that they get a refund of everything but \$10.

So, it seems to me it might instead be easier, instead of having DSPS prorate the fee, to have the applicant pay the full fee and then have DSPS issue a prorated refund if/when the license is issued. Would that make sense to you?

440.03 (9) (a) (intro.) Subject to pars: (b) and (c) and s. 440.05 (1) (a) 2., the department shall, biennially, determine each fee for an initial credential for which no examination is required, for a reciprocal credential, and for a credential renewal by doing all of the following:

You suggested having the licensure period broken up by calendar quarters. However, not all license renewal dates fall at the ends or beginnings of calendar quarters. As I indicated via smail, another approach would be to have DSPS refund the prorated amount after approving an application. In addition to that, here are some other approaches you could consider:

- 1. Requiring DSPS to offer the prorated amount as a credit that can be applied toward the next renewal fee, though this would be of no benefit to someone who does not end up renewing his or her license.
- 2. Requiring DSPS to simply waive the renewal fee for those who apply for an initial license within X days prior to the next renewal date. This approach has been used to exempt licensees from having to complete continuing education requirements.

These approaches, however, would be of no benefit to someone who does not end up renewing his or her license.

Otherwise, if you like the approach taken in this draft, in the next version I will have to amend numerous other cross-references in the statutes, just to account for the prorating scheme. I did not make those purely technical changes in this version because doing so will add to the length of the draft significantly and it will be easier to review initially without those changes.
