Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This legislation would create the Wisconsin Veterans Employment Initiative, which would seek to increase the number of veterans holding permanent state employment positions. The bill also creates a Council on Veterans Employment, which includes the Secretary of the Department of Administration (DOA) or his designee. The council would advise and assist the governor and state agencies with the recruitment and employment of veterans, including specifically veterans with a service-connected disability rating, so as to increase veteran employment in state government. The Department of Workforce Development (DWD) is assigned to provide staff support to the council.

Under this legislation, state agencies with more than 100 full—time employees must prepare and implement a plan to employ qualified veterans with the goal of having the proportion of veterans employed in the agency equal to the proportion of veterans in the state civilian labor force. These agencies must also prepare and implement a similar plan to employ qualified veterans with a service—connected disability rating. Agencies with 100 or fewer full-time employees would be encouraged to pursue this goal. The Council on Veterans Employment could establish different employment goals for veterans in state agencies.

Currently, the WiscjobsforVets Program under DWD been a mechanism for helping agencies recruit and hire disabled veterans. This bill establishes a regularly active role in which the Division of Personnel Management (DPM) within DOA would develop, implement and sustain a human resources staff training program to guide all agencies in recruiting and hiring veterans.

For purposes of this estimate, it is assumed that the costs of participation of the Secretary of DOA or his designee on the Council would be minor and could be accommodated within DOA's existing budget.

It is estimated that the development and administration of the training program would require one (1.0 FTE) Human Resources Specialist-Senior (\$100,000 for salary & fringe and \$15,000 for supplies/services/overhead) and one (1.0 FTE) Human Resources Assistant (\$65,000 for salary & fringe and \$15,000 for supplies/services/overhead).

In addition it is estimated that the development and initial implementation (first-year) of the program will require \$100,000 for recruitment efforts, training and other items to be determined as the program is created. Ongoing administration of the program is estimated to cost \$50,000 annually.

DPM does not have sufficient resources to dedicate or reallocate to the activities that would be required by this legislation. Therefore, the first-year cost is estimated at \$295,000 with ongoing costs for the second and subsequent years estimated at \$245,000.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

The ongoing costs for the second and subsequent years is estimated at \$245,000.
