Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill requires University of Wisconsin System (UWS) institutions and technical colleges to waive application fees for state residents who are high school juniors or seniors who apply during the second full week of October. The bill appropriates general purpose revenues to reimburse UWS institutions and technical colleges for the fees that are waived.

In order to determine the potential impact of this legislation, the number of applications in the months of September and October for FY 2016 were analyzed. UWS keeps application totals on a monthly basis. It is highly likely that students would either wait to apply until the second week of October or apply earlier than normal if the application fee was waived, so the impact of the waiver was estimated by dividing the total number of October applications by two and including the applications from September. This projection is assumed to be low because it is likely that students will apply to more institutions with all application fees waived. The current application fee of \$44 was used for this estimate.

Determining the residency of applicants is done by a computer program. Each campus determines the information that is required for an applicant to be designated as a resident. Once an applicant is accepted, if the student disagrees with their residency designation, they may dispute the designation.

This waiver period will add the potential for application fee reimbursements that will need to be made to students who applied during the second week of October who were incorrectly designated as nonresidents. It may also result in waivers to students wrongly designated as residents. The time required to process these reimbursements would vary by institution and adds uncertainty to the reimbursement amount and timetable.

The current program for sorting applications would have to be changed at the System level to comply with this bill. Currently an application fee or a request for a waiver of the application fee based on financial hardship is required to submit an application. UW System would have to change the program to allow students who could prove their residency status to waive the application fee during the second week in October. The cost of changing the program is unknown.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

There is currently no waiver period for application fees. Creating a period of time when the fee is waived may result in an increase of applications during that week. Students may also choose to apply to more UWS institutions than previous years which may increase the reimbursement costs in the future. An influx in applications will also result in more staff time needed to process the additional applications.

Recently, institutions were permitted to change their application fees under Wis. Stat. 36.11(3)(d). For example, next year UW-Madison's application fee will increase to \$50. Further changes to applications fees may also increase the reimbursement costs.
