If you transfer the funding in 2015-16, you might as well increase the appropriation in the same year. However, I would split it evenly between the two years (that is, raise the appropriation to \$2.0 million each year) unless you are going to try to enact another transfer in 2016-17. Even if the PSC can't spend the entire \$2.0 million in 2015-16, it is a "continuing" appropriation so the spending authority is retained until the entire amount is spent, regardless of fiscal year. However, since s. 196.504(2)(a) prohibits spending more than \$1.5 million, I would amend that statute to allow the expenditure of a larger amount. Recognizing that the PSC might not be able to spend the entire \$2.0 million in 2015-16, you should build some flexibility into the cap. I would raise the cap to \$2.5 million in any year. I hope this helps.

Hi Beau: I've discussed your request with staff at the PSC and have some information to share with you. The October 15, 2015 Annual Fiscal Report shows a 2014-15 USF closing balance of \$8.5 million. Act 55 reduces that amount by \$6.0 million through a transfer to the appropriation for broadband expansion grants, funding that appropriation at \$1.5 million per year for the 2015-17 biennium and, presumably, the 2017-19 biennium. Thus, the available balance is approximately \$2.5 million. In addition, the AFR shows 2014-15 USF revenues (\$42.5 million) exceeding USF expenditures (\$39.6 million) by \$2.9 million. If revenues and expenditures continue at those levels in 2015-16, we could expect the balance to increase by an additional \$2.9 million. However, the PSC reduced assessments for the coming year, and we expect revenues to decrease by about \$1.4 million in response. In addition, the decreasing number of landlines also contributes to "soft" revenues on an ongoing basis. These amounts suggest that the end-of-year balance for 2015-16 may be around \$4.0 million. For the five years between 2009-10 and 2013-14, the USF closing balance ranged from \$1.8 million to \$5.6 million, and averaged \$4.2 million. Consequently, the 2015-16 balance may be reasonably close to the 5-year average. If you are committed to proposing a transfer of some amount from the fund, you may want to limit the amount to about \$1 million, as of July 1, 2016. This would allow for a balance of perhaps \$3 million to address PSC concerns related to cash-flow and potential revenue variability. Another approach would be to designate broadband expansion grants as an allowable use of USF contributions and direct the PSC to impose an assessment for that purpose sufficient to cover the funding level that you determine. AN ACT ...; relating to: funding for broadband expansion grants and making an

appropriation.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill increases the appropriation from the universal service fund for broadband expansion grants by \$1,000,000 in fiscal year 2015–16 and \$1,000,000 in fiscal year 2016–17. Under current law, the Public Service Commission uses the appropriation to make grants for constructing broadband infrastructure in areas served by fewer than (2) broadband service providers. The bill also limits the total amount of grants that the PSC can make in a fiscal year to \$2,500,000. Under current law, that limit is \$1,500,000.

For further information see the **state** fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- 3 SECTION 1. 20.155 (3) (r) of the statutes, as created by 2015 Wisconsin Act 55, 4 is amended to read:

(d). Grants awarded under this section shall be paid from the appropriation under s. 20.155 (3) (r). In each fiscal year, the total amount of the grants may not exceed \$1,500,000 \$2,500,000. ✓

(2) In the schedule under section 20.005 (3) of the statutes for the appropriation to the public service commission under section 20.155 (3) (r) of the statutes, as affected by the acts of 2015, the dollar amount for fiscal year 2015–16 is increased by \$1,000,000 and the dollar amount for fiscal year 2016–17 is increased by \$1,000,000 for the purpose for which the appropriation is made.
