

STATUTORY MODIFICATIONS**

DIVISION: Division of Motor Vehicles

TOPIC: Omnibus Driver Safety Improvement Package

DESCRIPTION OF CHANGE:

As the average age of drivers increases, and the technology available to the residents of Wisconsin improves, DMV will need to re-evaluate its allocation of resources. Listed below are four changes to s.343, Wis.Stats., to address driver safety:

1. Provide non-expiring ID cards for individuals over age 65
 - 343.50(5)(b)
 - Currently Wisconsin issues 8 year Identification cards that can be renewed either online or by mail on an alternating cycle (renewals must be done in-person if the prior renewal was done online).
 - Over 80% of the ID cards issued are currently issued for free. Persons that pay for their ID product are generally individuals that do not indicate that the product is needed for the purposes of voting, or those that do not meet the age or citizenship requirements for voting.
 - Providing a non-expiring ID card promotes voluntary surrender of an individual's driver license, allowing seniors the option of never having to return to a DMV field office again.
2. Provide 8 year products for persons moving to Wisconsin from another state
 - 343.20(1)(a), (e)
 - 343.21(1)(a), (am)
 - Currently when an individual from out of state moves to Wisconsin and applies for a driver license they are issued a three-year product rather than a normal eight-year product.
 - There is no safety justification for requiring these individuals to obtain a product with a shorter period of time than a normal renewal.
 - This change will reduce the number of visits a new Wisconsin resident has to visit a DMV field station, allowing for improved wait times.
3. Option for Alternating in-person/online renewals for safe driver history (under age 65)
 - 343.16(3)
 - Option for alternating in-person/online renewals for safe driver history (under age 65)
 - a. This initiative would allow an individual to waive the eye exam and renew their driver license online as long as they had not renewed online for their prior driver license renewal.
 - b. Looking to the usage of the online plate renewal application for guidance we expect 20% of the users to utilize this tool, improving customer satisfaction and reducing wait times in the field stations.
4. Option for Instruction Permit (IP) holders to shift to a Probationary License (PL) and Probationary License holders to shift to a regular license online
 - 343.165
 - Probationary License holders to shift to a regular license, online
 - Similar to number 3 above this would allow individuals holding an IP to upgrade to a PL or from a PL to a regular license online. Eligibility to shift from IP to PL assumes all

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relevant tests have been passed and are on system. This is especially beneficial if Class D skills test waivers (see #6 below) are in effect.

- This would improve the customers experience while reducing wait times in the DMV field stations.

Under current law, most operator's licenses issued by the Department of Transportation (DOT) must be renewed every eight years. In general, an applicant for renewal of an operator's license must pass an eyesight test and have his or her photograph taken.

Under this bill, if an applicant for renewal of a license to operate only "Class D" vehicles, which includes automobiles and most other passenger vehicles, is under 65 years of age and satisfies other eligibility requirements established by DOT, the applicant may apply for renewal, and DOT may renew the license, by electronic means. The renewal may occur without an eyesight test and without a photograph. The renewal by electronic means procedure may be used by an applicant once in each 16 year period.

Under current law, DOT issues identification cards, to be used for identification purposes only, to residents who do not possess valid operator's licenses. The cards

expire eight years from the date of the person's next birthday. Under this bill, an identification card issued to a person who is 65 years of age or older at the time of issuance does not expire.

Under current law, various rules govern the expiration of operator's licenses. Most operator's licenses issued by the DOT expire eight years after the date of issuance. Probationary licenses, ~~licenses issued after cancellation,~~ and original licenses other than instruction permits expire two years from the date of the person's next birthday. Licenses issued to certain persons who move to the state and who have been licensed in another state expire three years from the date of the person's next birthday.

Under this bill, the specific provisions regarding the expiration date of original licenses other than instruction permits and licenses issued to persons who move to the state are repealed. In general, under this bill, licenses issued to persons who move to the state will expire eight years after the date of issuance.

Under current law, the fee for the initial issuance of a license authorizing only the operation of "Class D" vehicles is \$18 and the fee for the renewal of such a license is \$24. Under this bill, the fee for the issuance or renewal of such a license, except a probationary license, is \$24 and the fee for the issuance of a probationary license is \$18.
