DESCRIPTION OF CHANGE:

As the average age of drivers increases, and the technology available to the residents of Wisconsin improves, DMV will need to re-evaluate its allocation of resources. Listed below are four changes to s.343, Wis.Stats., to address driver safety:

- 1. Provide non-expiring ID cards for individuals over age 65
 - 343.50(5)(b)
 - Currently Wisconsin issues 8 year Identification cards that can be renewed either online
 or by mail on an alternating cycle (renewals must be done in-person if the prior renewal
 was done online).
 - Over 80% of the ID cards issued are currently issued for free. Persons that pay for their ID product are generally individuals that do not indicate that the product is needed for the purposes of voting, or those that do not meet the age or citizenship requirements for voting.
 - Providing a non-expiring ID card promotes voluntary surrender of an individual's driver license, allowing seniors the option of never having to return to a DMV field office again.
- 2. Provide 8 year products for persons moving to Wisconsin from another state
 - 343.20(1)(a), (e)
 - 343.21(1)(a), (am)
 - Currently when an individual from out of state moves to Wisconsin and applies for a
 driver license they are issued a three-year product rather than a normal eight-year
 product.
 - There is no safety justification for requiring these individuals to obtain a product with a shorter period of time than a normal renewal.
 - This change will reduce the number of visits a new Wisconsin resident has to visit a DMV field station, allowing for improved wait times.
- 3. Option for Alternating in-person/online renewals for safe driver history (under age 65)
 - 343.16(3)
 - Option for alternating in-person/online renewals for safe driver history (under age 65)
 - a. This initiative would allow an individual to waive the eye exam and renew their driver license online as long as they had not renewed online for their prior driver license renewal.
 - Looking to the usage of the online plate renewal application for guidance we expect 20% of the users to utilize this tool, improving customer satisfaction and reducing wait times in the field stations.
- Option for Instruction Permit (IP) holders to shift to a Probationary License (PL) and Probationary License holders to shift to a regular license online
 - 343.165
 - Probationary License holders to shift to a regular license, online
 - Similar to number 3 above this would allow individuals holding an IP to upgrade to a PL
 or from a PL to a regular license online. Eligibility to shift from IP to PL assumes all

relevant tests have been passed and are on system. This is especially beneficial if Class D skills test waivers (see #6 below) are in effect. This would improve the customers experience while reducing wait times in the DMV field stations.



Under this bill, the fee for the issuance or renewal of such a license, except a probationary license, is \$24 and the fee for the issuance of a probationary license is \$18.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:
