Eliminate the current law lifetime cap of 20 enterprise zones and instead give WEDC an annual allocation of 5 zones that may be certified each year. Additionally, allow WEDC to request additional zone allocations from the Joint Committee on Finance if WEDC demonstrates sufficient need for an additional allocation in a given year.

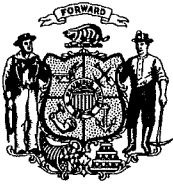

If the committee approves or modifies the request, the corporation may exceed the annual limit specified in par. (a) in the manner described in the request as approved or modified.~~
