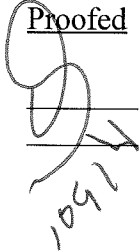

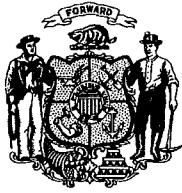

Mark,

There has been a change to the performance funding piece. Instead of the performance funding being 30% in 2016-2017 and thereafter, the performance funding should be as follows:

- 10% in 2014-2015 *same*
- 20% in 2015-2016 *same*
- 30% in 2016-2017 *same*
- 40% in 2017-2018
- 50% in 2018-2019
- 100% in 2019-2020 and each fiscal year thereafter

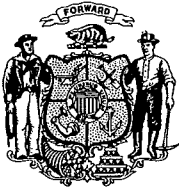
