Current law prohibits a person from operating a snowmobile in this state unless the snowmobile is covered by a public—use or private—use registration issued by the DNR, is registered as an antique snowmobile, or is exempt from registration. A person who owns a snowmobile is generally exempt from snowmobile registration requirements in this state if the snowmobile is covered by a valid registration in another state or country. A public—use registration is valid for two years and a private—use registration is valid until ownership of the snowmobile is transferred. Beginning July 1, 2015, a public—use registration for a snowmobile that is not an antique is valid for three years. This bill provides that beginning July 1, 2015, the registration certificate for an antique snowmobile is also valid for 3 years.

Under current law, a person who owns a snowmobile that is not registered in this state or is exempt from registration must display a trail use sticker issued by DNR on the snowmobile. Beginning July 1, 2015, all snowmobiles, with limited exceptions, must display a trail use sticker and pay a fee for the sticker, regardless of whether the snowmobile is registered in this state. One exception to this requirement provides that a person is not required to pay a fee for a trail use sticker issued for a snowmobile that has a model year that is at least 30 years earlier than the year in which the trail use sticker is issued. This bill eliminates this fee exception.

If the snowmobile is registered on or after April 1 of a given year, the 2-year 3-year period begins on the July 1 after the date of application. The fee for issuance of the initial registration certificate is \$20. The fee for renewal of the registration is \$5.

I have a modification to LRB 0442 related to antique snowmobile registration.

- 1. We want to keep the antique snowmobile trail use sticker exemption under 350.12(3j)(br) section 4 of the draft but modify the eligible age from snowmobiles" at least 30 years" to "at least 35 years." This will undo sections 2 and 3 of the draft and reconcile the qualifying age of an antique snowmobile in Act 233 (antique snowmobile registration) with Act 142 (antique snowmobile trail use sticker).
- 2. The sections related to extending the antique registration period from 2 to 3 years are perfect. No changes.
- 3. Thanks for your note on the effective date; I agree with July 1, 2015.
