Require the state superintendent to issue an alternative teaching license to an individual that has a bachelor's degree and has passed a competency exam to demonstrate adequate knowledge in each of the subjects the applicant is assigned to teach. This alternative license shall only be available for applicants assigned to teach regular education in the middle and high school grades.

Provide that the license is renewable in three year terms.

115.28 (7) (f) (gs) Notwithstanding s. 118.19 (3), (4m), (6) to (9), and (12) to (14),

grant a teaching license to any individual who has a bachelor's degree and

1 demonstrates by passing a competency exam approved by the department that he or
2 she is proficient in the subject or subjects that he or she intends to teach. The license
3 authorizes the person to teach only that subject or those subjects in grades 6 to 12.
4 The license is valid for 3 years and is renewable for 3-year periods.
