Waylon,

I received some proposed statutory language that would allow technical colleges to create an employee benefits consortium to provide health care benefits to their employees. As we discussed, §66.0137 Wis. Stats. does not clearly provide technical colleges the authority for a consortium to jointly provide self-insured health care benefits. The following statutory amendments would be very helpful efficiency measure for the colleges.

Section 66.0137

- (4m) Joint self-insured plans.
 - (a) In this subsection, "political subdivision" means a city, village, town, or technical college.
 - (b) A political subdivision and one or more other political subdivisions, that together have at least 100 employees, may jointly provide health care benefits, including stop loss coverage, to their officers and employees on a self insured basis.
- (c) Any plan under par. (b) shall comply with the provisions listed in sub. (4).

At this time it appears that five colleges are interested in creating a health care consortium: Fox Valley, Lakeshore, Moraine Park, Southwest, and Waukesha. Although additional colleges would likely join in the future.

I spoke to the health care consortiums attorneys and the HR director at Fox Valley Technical College who is leading this effort. They requested additional language in one area.

Page 2, line 7" 2. Procure stop loss insurance or jointly self-insure stop loss risk.

The reason is that the consortium intends to not only purchase stop loss insurance as a third tier of coverage, but also to jointly self-insure stop loss risk among the participating colleges as a second tier of coverage. The attorneys were concerned that the proposed language would not allow that to happen.

The attorneys also were concerned about the Title on page 1, line 3, which included the word "procurement".

HIGHER EDUCATION

Under current law, a city, village, town, or county (political subdivision) may, with one or more other political subdivisions, jointly provide health care benefits to their officers and employees on a self–insured basis if the political subdivisions together have at least 100 employees.

This bill allows technical college districts, under the same conditions, to join with other technical college districts to jointly provide health care benefits on a self-insured basis. The bill also allows technical college districts to jointly procure stop loss insurance and jointly self-insure stop loss risk.

For further information see the *local* fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.
