The request would reflect creation of a shared services pilot program in Chapter 16. DOA would have responsibility for human resources, payroll, finance, budget and procurement functions for the new regulatory agency (DFIPS), Public Service Commission, State Fair Park, Educational Communications Board, Higher Education Aids Board, State Historical Society, Wisconsin Technical College System Board, Department of Tourism, Board of Commissioners of Public Lands and Government Accountability Board. The intent is not to administratively attach these agencies to DOA under Chapter 15, but rather to centralize the back-office functions listed.

Additionally, DOA would have responsibility for all information technology services to the ten agencies listed above, as well as for Board on Aging and Long-Term Care, Board for People with Developmental Disabilities, Office of the Governor, Office of the Lieutenant Governor, Office of the State Treasurer and Secretary of State. A subset of the current position count in each functional area would be transferred to DOA, but current incumbents would have to reapply for the transferred positions.

As part of this request, require DOA to study an enterprise-wide shared services model for implementation in the 2017-19 budget. The department would need to submit an implementation plan incorporating results of the study to the Governor and Legislature no later than June 30, 2016.



This bill requires DOA to administer human resources and payroll services, finance services, budget and procurement functions, and information technology services for certain state agencies and boards. This bill also requires DOA to study an enterprise—wide model for shared services and to submit an implementation plan incorporating the results of the study to the governor and the legislature by June 30, 2016.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

2 Section 1. 16.004 (20) of the statutes is created to read:

16.004 (20) Office Services. (a) In this subsection, "shared services agency" means the department of financial institutions, the department of safety and professional services, the public service commission, the state fair park board, the

educational communications board, the higher educational aids board, the state
historical society, the technical college system board, the department of tourism, the
board of commissioners of public lands, and the government accountability board.

- (b) The department shall administer for each shared services agency its responsibilities to provide human resources services, payroll services, finance services, budget functions, and procurement functions. The department may charge agencies for services provided to them under this subsection in accordance with a methodology determined by the department.
- **SECTION 2.** 16.004 (20) (a) of the statutes, as created by 2015 Wisconsin Act (this act), is amended to read:

The department shall submit an implementation plan incorporating the results of the study to the governor and the legislature by June 30, 2016.
