

- 1) Would you please delete the phrase "or who are at risk of becoming the victims"...there will be enough youth to serve who are victims.
- 2) DCF raised the concern that the last sentence suggests that they have to provide services to all kids who need it (like a sum sufficient appropriation), but won't have the funds to do so. They suggest something like: Children in all geographic areas of the state, including both urban and rural communities, shall be eligible for consideration of treatment and services under this section.
