Various provisions of current law authorize specific maximum levels of general obligation bonding for these projects and the total authorized amount of general obligation bonding available for these projects is the cumulative amount specified in all of these provisions.

Under one of these provisions of current law, the state may contract up to \$141,000,000 in public debt to fund state highway rehabilitation projects. This bill increases this authorized general obligation bonding limit to \$383,386,600.
