Hi Scott, per our conversation earlier about SB110/AB 157, the buoy bill, a few amendment options include to specify that the liability protection under the bill does not apply to a person if the harm is caused by a malicious act of the person (similar to an exception under the recreational immunity law and other laws), the harm is caused by the willful or wanton disregard for the safety of others (further defined under and similar to an exception under the agricultural tourism law), or the person intentionally causes the harm (also in the ag tourism law and a relevant factor in numerous others).

Also, if you would like to apply the liability protection under the bill only to uncompensated people, an amendment could specify that the bill's protection does not apply to a person who collects money, goods or services in payment for the placement of buoys.
