The department would like to amend sections 30 and 34 of SB 158 and AB 209 (permission from Rep. Ripp's office is attached), relating to CDLs, to codify the prohibition regarding the "use of a hand-held mobile telephone", as defined in 49 CFR 390.5, for operators of commercial motor vehicles (CMV) while driving that is specified in 49 CFR 392.82.

The intent of these proposed changes are to allow operators of CMVs to continue using a hands-free telephone device in the same manner as what is currently allowed under existing Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) regulations. These changes will ensure that the bill is not more restrictive than what is required under federal law, in regards to the use of telephones by CMV operators.

Below is how we believe this would be accomplished, however, I'll obviously defer to LRB on exact changes. (Note: Our modifications to the bill are highlighted in yellow)

Page 11 of the bill:

1) SECTION 30. 343.315 (2) (f) 10. of the statutes is created to read:

343.315 (2) (f) 10. Violating s. 346.89 (4) (b) or a local ordinance in conformity therewith or a law of a federally recognized American Indian tribe or band in this state in conformity with s. 346.89 (4) (b) or the law of another jurisdiction prohibiting driving a commercial motor vehicle, as defined in 49 CFR 390.5, while using a cellular or other wireless hand-held mobile telephone, as those or substantially similar terms are used in that jurisdiction's law. In this subdivision, "mobile telephone" has the meaning given in 49 CFR 390.5.

2) SECTION 34. 346.89 (4) (b) of the statutes is created to read:

346.89 **(4)** (b) Subject to sub. (3), no person may drive, as defined in s. 343.305 (1) (b), <u>including while</u> temporarily stationary because of traffic, a traffic control device or other momentary delays, any commercial motor vehicle, as defined in 49 CFR 390.5, while using a cellular or other wireless <u>hand-held mobile</u> telephone, except to report an emergency, emergency, by doing any of the following:

- 1. Using at least one hand to hold a mobile telephone or any connected accessories to conduct a voice communication.
 - 2. Dialing or answering a mobile telephone by pressing more than a single button.
- 3. Reaching for a mobile telephone in a manner that requires a driver to maneuver so that he or she is no longer in a seated driving position.

SECTION 34m. 346.89 (4) (c) of the statutes is created to read:

346.89 (4) (c) In par. (b), "mobile telephone" has the meaning given in 49 CFR 390.5.



Hi Eric,

The department has one minor modification (proposed change is highlighted below) to the draft amendment (LRB–a0566/P1), to SB 158, which is the following:

- Page 2, line 2: delete "emergency," and substitute "emergency to law enforcement officials or other emergency service providers,".
 - "2. Subject to sub. (3), except to report an emergency, to law enforcement officials or other emergency service providers, no person may drive any commercial motor vehicle while using a hand-held mobile telephone in any the following manners:"

In regards to item #2 in your drafter's note, since there is an existing requirement for a seat belt to be used (s. 347.48(2m), Stats.), does a provision relating to the seat-belt requirement need to be also referenced in this bill, or is the provision listed in ch. 347 suffice? Staff believed that since there was already an existing requirement for a seat belt to be used, this particular federal provision ("... restrained by a seat belt...") was not necessary for inclusion in the bill, but I will defer to your judgment.

The other changes included in the draft amendment look good. I'll give you a call on Monday to briefly discuss.

Thanks again for working on these changes for us.


