Rick,

I wasn't sure what attorney to send this to.

I'm looking to draft legislation that would create 2 FTE at the Office of Skills Development within the Department of Workforce Development. The funds for the positions would come from the Fast Forward appropriation for grants. I would think if we up the administration of the program by \$200,000 that should cover it.

These positions would be tasked with working with employers and higher education institutions to increase the number of internships students participate in. We would call them internship coordinators. The annual report on Fast Forward in 106.27(3) would need to add in the number of internships that the Office of Skills Development, where these 2 FTE would be, have impacted. So at the end of that section it could read something like, "The report shall include the number of internships impacted in partnership with employers and higher education institutions."
