## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

This bill expands what constitutes the crime of child sex trafficking and includes child sex trafficking under the definition of abuse in the Children's Code. The bill requires the reporting and investigation of certain child abuse cases.

Sex trafficking and abuse cases are very time-consuming, so prosecutors believe this bill, if enacted, will have a fiscal impact on their offices. Because there are no data regarding the potential number of violations of this bill, a fiscal estimate is indeterminate.

## **Long-Range Fiscal Implications**

Prosecutors expect that this bill, should it be enacted, will result in a long-term fiscal impact on their offices, though a lack of data regarding the number of potential violations makes a fiscal estimate indeterminate.
