Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

SB 618 would add child sex trafficking to the definition of "abuse" in the Children's Code and requires reporting instances of suspected child abuse. These changes in definitions and requirements are not expected to cause any significant changes to workload or costs within DOJ.
