Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill requires a law enforcement officer to report to his/her law enforcement agency a suspected controlled-substance violation involving certain drugs or an opioid-related drug overdose or death, or a report of a stolen controlled-substance prescription. The law enforcement agency must provide the information to the Prescription Drug Monitoring Program.

Prosecutors do not expect there to be a fiscal impact on their offices as a result of enactment of this bill.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

Should this bill be enacted, prosecutors do not anticipate any long-term fiscal effect on their offices.
