Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The fiscal impact is indeterminate. No requests for waivers have ever been filed under the original provisions, and the PSC has never had to investigate service offerings under this chapter. The only potential cost would arise if it became necessary to adjudicate the meaning of adding the word "effectively" in 196.503(2)(a). This addition would appear to change the requirement from one of a tariffed service offering to potentially something less. However, there is no evidence that any provider would seek to exploit that change in a manner detrimental to customers. If providers did not, no adjudication would be required.

The fiscal estimate of this bill on local governments, businesses and homeowners is not determinable. The addition of the word "effectively" in 196.503(2)(a) raises the potential for some lesser level of service or availability, or for voice service to be provided in a way that is less valuable or usable by customers. This would require both a determination that the addition of the word "effectively" allows for a change in service offering and a desire on the part of providers to make that change.
