## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

Under current law, a court may authorize a search warrant that allows a law enforcement officer to search and seize anything that is the fruit of, or has been used in, the commission of a crime or that may constitute evidence of a crime, if the court finds probable cause to believe that the search will yield evidence of the crime.

Under this bill, the court would be able to, upon finding probable cause, to authorize a search warrant that allows a law enforcement officer to search and seize anything that is the fruit of, or has been used in, the commission of a crime or of a civil violation of the prohibitions against driving while having a prohibited alcohol concentration or while under the influence of an intoxicant, a controlled substance, a controlled substance analog, or any combination of an intoxicant, a controlled substance and a controlled substance analog.

There would be no fiscal impact of this legislation on the Department of Corrections (DOC). The Department has Probation & Parole Agents, Correctional Officers, and Sergeants, but they are not law enforcement officers. They do not have arresting powers and therefore would always contact local or state police to respond to any incident where an arrest could possibly be made.

DOC is unable to determine the fiscal impact of this legislation on local governments; therefore the fiscal impact of local government is indeterminate.

**Long-Range Fiscal Implications**
