## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law, counties are reimbursed for probation, parole, and extended supervision holds in accordance with Wis. Stat. §302.33(2)(a), which directs DOC to reimburse counties at a rate of \$40 per day. If the amount provided for under §20.410(1)(bn) is insufficient to reimburse at \$40 per day, counties are to be reimbursed at a prorated amount.

This bill directs DOC to reimburse counties at \$40 per day using amounts provided under §20.410(1)(bn), and if those funds are not sufficient to reimburse counties at that rate, to utilize any funds remaining in §20.410(1)(gf) after paying all costs incurred for probation, parole, and extended supervision. The bill also states that if the amounts provided under §20.410(1)(bn) and §20.410(1)(gf) are insufficient to provide reimbursement at the \$40 rate, the department shall prorate the payments across all counties for that fiscal year.

The amount provided under §20.410(1)(bn) has not been sufficient to reimburse counties at the \$40 per day rate since 2004. The reimbursement rate for FY2015 was \$35.84 for a total of 136,319 bed days. The amount provided under §20.410(1)(bn) for FY15 was \$4,885,700. If this bill had been enacted, \$567,100 would have been utilized from §20.410(1)(gf) resulting in a \$40.00 reimbursement rate for a total of 136,319 bed days in FY15.

The DOC does not anticipate that this legislation will result in any new or increased costs for the department.

Local Government Costs:

As a result of this bill, counties may see an increase in the reimbursement rate for probation, parole, and extended supervision holds.
