Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

If the victim is under the age of 18, this bill increases the penalty from a misdemeanor to a felony for a variety of actions in which a person, for sexual arousal or gratification: installs a surveillance device in a private place; looks into a private place of public accommodation where a person may expect privacy; looks into an individual's dwelling; captures a representation of a nude person where the person has an expectation of privacy; posts a representation of a nude person, knowing that the representation is a private representation; and, intentionally captures a representation of a nude or partially nude person in a locker room without the person's permission.

Prosecutors anticipate there likely will be violations of this law, should it be enacted and, because violations would be felonies, defendants are more likely to go to jury trial, which is very time-consuming. However, there is insufficient data to indicate how many violations could occur and the potential impact on prosecutors' workloads. Consequently, a fiscal estimate is indeterminate.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

As stated above, should this bill be enacted, a long-term fiscal impact is indeterminate.
