#### Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill allows an adult child who is being prevented from visiting or communicating with his or her parent to petition a court for visitation. The bill applies to a parent who is a resident of a hospital, hospice, nursing home, or a community-based residential facility.

Under this bill, the Department may be called upon to investigate a complaint that arises in a hospital, hospice, nursing home, or community-based residential facility as a result of this new legislation.

This bill will result in ongoing costs to DHS. These costs must be funded by 100% GPR because the bill creates state-only regulations, with no corresponding federal requirement for which the Department could claim federal activity. This bill would increase ongoing costs by increasing the number of complaints responded to by an estimated two annually. The cost of responding to two complaints filed against a hospital, hospice, nursing home, or a community-based residential facility annually is \$2,300 GPR. This estimate is based on an average of 29.7 hours required to respond to a complaint filed against a hospital, hospice, nursing home, or community-based residential facility and an estimate of two complaints received per year under the provisions of this bill. The Department can absorb these costs.
