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### **2015 ASSEMBLY BILL 766**

Assembly Bill 766 requires the Controlled Substances Board (CSB) to do the following:

- Submit an annual review of the Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP) to the Department of Safety and Professional Services (DSPS) evaluating actual and projected outcomes, starting on October 1, 2017, and ending October 1, 2020.
- Submit an annual report to DSPS for previous fiscal year, setting forth the results of the review described above and other specified information regarding the PDMP. The first annual report is due on November 1, 2017, and the last annual report is due on November 1, 2020.

### **ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 1**

Assembly Amendment 1 makes the following changes to the bill:

- Changes both the review and report from annual to quarterly.
- Specifies that the first review and the first report are due in third quarter of 2016.
- Authorizes CSB to contract with an analytics firm to “augment” the PDMP with an analytics platform.

### **BILL HISTORY**

On February 10, 2016, the Assembly Committee on Health voted to recommend adoption of Assembly Amendment 1 on a vote of Ayes, 11; Noes, 0. The committee then voted to recommend passage of the bill, as amended, on a vote of Ayes, 11; Noes, 0.

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
