2015 ASSEMBLY BILL 792

The bill requires a law enforcement agency that has issued a Silver Alert to refer the person making the missing person report to a local aging and disability resource center. The bill also requires the Department of Transportation (DOT) to review the driver's license of the person who is the subject of a Silver Alert to determine if restrictions should be placed on the person's license for the safety of them and others.

ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 1

The amendment clarifies that the law enforcement agency that issues a Silver Alert must notify DOT of the identity of the adult reported missing so DOT can complete the review of the person's driver's license.

BILL HISTORY

Assembly Amendment 1 was introduced by Representative Skowronski on January 27, 2016. On February 1, 2016, the Assembly Committee on Mental Health Reform recommended adoption of the amendment, on a vote of Ayes, 10; Noes 0. On the same day, the committee recommended passage of the bill, as amended, on a vote of Ayes, 10; Noes 0.
