






# WEDC's Economic Development Awards in FY 2015-16

## Award Amounts in Millions






# Administration of Grant, Loan, and Tax Credit Programs

---

We reviewed available information for 133 awards WEDC made.

Effective July 1, 2016, WEDC significantly changed how it made awards.

WEDC improved its administration of grant, loan, and tax credit programs during the first six months of FY 2016-17.




## Monitoring Loans

---

The potentially uncollectable balance of loans with repayments 90 days or more past due was:

- \$1.3 million on December 31, 2014; and
- \$11.0 million on December 31, 2016.



## Verification of Jobs

---

Statutes require WEDC to annually verify information submitted by tax credit recipients on the extent to which contractually required results were achieved.


For example, s. 238.399(6)(f), Wis. Stats., states that WEDC “shall annually verify the information submitted” by businesses claiming tax credits under the Enterprise Zone program.

WEDC did not annually verify jobs-related information.




# Annual Verification of Performance Information

---

WEDC paid a consultant to conduct the 2016 verification effort, which excluded grant recipients.

The consultant did not verify that award recipients actually created or retained contractually required jobs that paid at least 150.0 percent of the federal minimum wage.




## Assessing Award Effectiveness

---

WEDC indicated that 192 awards had ended through September 2016, including 24 awards for which it indicated that job creation or retention was an expected result.

WEDC cannot be certain about the numbers of jobs actually created or retained as a result of any awards that ended.




## Reporting Program Results

---

WEDC cannot be certain about the accuracy of jobs information in its online data because:

- it did not verify jobs-related information submitted by tax credit recipients; and
- it did not contractually require grant and loan recipients to submit information sufficiently detailed to allow it to determine jobs created or retained.




# Financial Management

---

WEDC's cash and investments balance increased from \$33.1 million as of June 30, 2012, to \$69.9 million as of June 30, 2016, or by 111.2 percent.

We include recommendations related to WEDC's fund balance policy and credit card management.



## **Issues for Legislative Consideration**

---

The Legislature could consider modifying statutes to:

- require WEDC to deposit all tax credits repaid to it with DOA within one week; and
- clarify that WEDC's governing board should report on only created or retained jobs that meet statutory and policy requirements.
