

AN ACT ...; relating to: exemptions from dog license fees.

### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under this bill, an owner of a dog is not required to pay an annual dog license fee if the dog is trained to provide specific physical or therapeutic functions under the control of a handler or if a medical professional has determined that the dog provides a benefit to a person with a disability. Under current law, only dogs that are trained to lead blind or deaf persons or to provide support for mobility-impaired persons are exempt from the annual dog license fee.

# The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

**Section 1.** 174.055 of the statutes is amended to read:

174.055 Exemption of <u>assistance</u> dogs for blind, deaf and mobility-impaired. Every dog that has been specially trained to lead blind or deaf persons or, guide, or assist a person whose vision or hearing is impaired, to provide support for mobility-impaired persons a person whose mobility is impaired, or to

provide specific physical or therapeutic functions under the direction and control of a qualified handler, and every dog that a medical professional has determined provides a benefit to a person with a disability, is exempt from the dog license tax and every person owning such a dog shall receive annually a free dog license from the local collecting officer upon application.




