I have a few draft revisions that I would like to request for LRB 2108. My revisions are below. I do have one question regarding drafting language and would appreciate any thoughts/suggestion you might have.

My concern relates to section 1, specifically the last line. I'm concerned about the language earlier in the sentence being too broad, so as to accidentally fence out some non-clinical functions that the DEB already does regulate, like continuing education. One thought was to simply exempt the section that outlines the current powers the DEB has, but I'm not sure if that is enough, or all encompassing. Could you give me your thoughts on this matter?

Section 1: Wis. Stat. 447.02 (4) is <u>created</u> to read:

#### **DEB Authority**

Except as provided in s. 447.058, nothing in this chapter may be construed as providing the examining board with jurisdiction to regulate business or administrative support functions that do not constitute the practice of dentistry or dental hygiene, except as provided under ss. 447.02 (1)

#### Section 2: Wis. Stat. 447.06(3) is <u>created</u> to read:

No contract described in subsection (1) may require a dentist or dental hygienist to meet any minimum quota for number of patients seen, or number or type of procedures performed.

#### Section 3: Wis. Stat. 447.105 is created to read:

#### Examining board access to patient health care records

If the examining board receives a complaint that a violation of this chapter has occurred, it may require, by order or subpoena, the production of patient health care records, as defined in s. 146.81(4), by any person having custody of such patient health care records. This requirement shall apply to any party having control of the operation of a dental practice under s. 447.06(1). Any person who violates this section may be subject to penalties under s. 447.09.
