Hi Steve -

I think the first question that needs to be answered is whether in fact Rep. Genrich wants to require a physical examination as a condition of employment. If not, then I think the cleanest thing to do is eliminate the language on page 2, lines 12 to 14 that the school board "shall ... require a physical examination of every school employee in the school district."

If that is not the goal, the next thing I would need to know is whether there is a particular class of school district employees that would be subject to the lesser (not physical examination) requirement, as is implied by the suggested language ("a school employee in a particular position").

If that is the case, then I would agree that you could direct the school district to establish a policy concerning that class of employees and, once that policy is in place, permit an RN to administer the screening questionnaire to those employees. However, I would want to clarify how it is determined that "a test to determine the presence or absence of tuberculosis is not indicated by the questionnaire." 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

What if we took that last sentence from the last paragraph and created a new last paragraph that read something like:

"If the tuberculosis factors were identified, the registered nurse or school nurse shall recommend that the person receive a test to determine the presence or absence of tuberculin in a communicable form. If the test is negative, a practitioner shall complete a certificate verifying that the school employee is free of tuberculosis in a communicable form."

The key is that we want to make sure that, if TB factors are identified, the process is taken out of the control of an RN. It then needs to be supervised by a practitioner.

Hi Steve -

I would recommend that you share the /P3 draft with your partners. The /P3 version may address this individual's concerns, but it may be the case that it doesn't accurately describe an RN's current practice. The individual seems to be making an argument about the interaction between the language in the /P2 and the TB Screening form in its current form. The presence of the certification on the form does raise the question: what happens when a teacher marks yes on the screening form? It is possible that the substance of the form may need to change as a result of the bill.

The /P3 draft of the bill provides instructions for the scenario your partner proposes, to wit, a patient who marks yes on the form. Under the bill, the RN must recommend that the person receive a test to determine the presence of TB. The question about how an RN must deal with a form that he or she cannot certify remains under the /P3 version: that is, does an RN who makes a recommendation that a teacher receive a TB test as required under the /P3 throw away a form that he or she cannot certify?

On the Tuberculosis Risk Assessment Questionnaire, if a person marks Yes to the history of positive TB test or TB disease, the school nurse or registered nurse would not proceed. We would not have access to the items mentioned in the paragraph below that. This individual would go to a practitioner.

A school nurse/RN would only proceed through this form if that question is marked no.

Moving on through the results, if any risk factors, the school nurse/RN would not sign the form, rather the individual would be referred to a practitioner for examination and recommendation.

The combination of risk assessment and or examination on the back of the form causes confusion. The statement is reading that they were examined and the school nurse/RN are not examining the individual.

The language on the Questionnaire needs two steps to indicate what the SN/RN is doing. Risk assessment is one. Depending upon the outcome of this, the certificate portion signed by the SN/RN cannot include examined. Two types of certificate may be needed to indicate appropriately what each level (SN/RN or practitioner) did.

Coming back to the Bill: language for the new paragraph would need to be changed if the one form is to be used by SN/RNs and practitioners unless the form would have levels for each to sign.
