



AN ACT to renumber and amend 944.31; and to create 944.31 (1) and 944.31

(2) of the statutes; relating to: patronizing a prostitute and providing a criminal penalty.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill makes a third or subsequent violation of patronizing a prostitute a Class I felony. Under the bill, a first or second violation remains a Class A misdemeanor.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 944.31 of the statutes is renumbered 944.31 (intro.) and amended to read:

944.31 Patronizing prostitutes. (intro.) Any person who enters or remains in any place of prostitution with intent to have nonmarital sexual intercourse or to commit an act of sexual gratification, in public or in private, involving the sex organ
