



## 2017 ASSEMBLY BILL 578

October 24, 2017 - Introduced by Representatives SARGENT, GENRICH, HEBL, KOLSTE, GOYKE, POPE, SPREITZER, NOVAK, SINICKI, BILLINGS, ZAMARRIPA, HESSELBEIN, ANDERSON, SHANKLAND, C. TAYLOR, BERCEAU, CROWLEY, HINTZ and FIELDS, cosponsored by Senators ERPENBACH, HANSEN, RINGHAND, LARSON, RISSER and VINEHOUT. Referred to Committee on Campaigns and Elections.

1     **AN ACT relating to:** increasing funding to the Elections Commission for elections  
2             administration positions and making an appropriation.

*Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau*

This bill increases the amount appropriated to the Elections Commission by \$304,100 in each year of the 2017-19 biennium in order to increase the number of FTE positions authorized to the Elections Commission by 5.0 FTE positions.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

3             **SECTION 1. Fiscal changes.**
