Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill requires the Department to establish a Palliative Care Council and to create a statewide palliative care consumer and professional information and education program. Both the Palliative Care Council and the associated DHS program would be established upon passage of this bill and would sunset effective July 1, 2028.

The bill requires the Secretary of DHS to appoint no more than 20 members to the Palliative Care Council, each serving a term of four years. The Council's required composition must include certain numbers of health care providers and other individuals with expertise in palliative care or hospice, including board certified physicians and registered nurses, licensed practical nurses, a social worker, a pharmacist, hospital administrators, patient advocates, a medical student, a representative from the UW School of Medicine and Public Health and another from the Medical College of Wisconsin, a medical student, and a representative from DHS with expertise in palliative care.

The Palliative Care Council is required to meet at least twice per year to consult with and advise the Department on (1) establishing, operating, and evaluating its palliative care consumer and professional information and education program; (2) understanding individual and family experiences with palliative care and evaluating palliative care's impact on individual participants and their families, and (3) developing a system for identifying individuals who may benefit from palliative care and for providing information to facilitate access to appropriate palliative care services. Semi-annual meetings of the Palliative Care Council would require overnight travel for the 20 Council members and 4 additional DHS support staff. Estimated annual costs for the meeting space, equipment, food, lodging, and travel reimbursement for all participants is \$8,400 GPR per year.

In addition to the requirement that a DHS staff member assign a representative to the Palliative Care Council, this bill requires the Department to publish electronic information and resources about palliative care on the DHS website for the benefit of the public, health care providers, and health care institutions. The bill specifically requires that the Department provide links to external palliative care resources; continuing education opportunities for health care providers; information about palliative care delivery in the home and other health care settings; and consumer educational materials on palliative care programs and services, including hospice. The bill further requires the Palliative Care Council to develop and submit a biennial report to Wisconsin Legislature on its activities, findings, and recommendations.

The Department requires an increase of 1.0 FTE in a Program and Policy Analyst – Advanced position to participate on the Palliative Care Council, oversee the development and implementation of the statewide palliative care consumer and professional information and education program, and compile the biennial report to the Legislature. Ongoing annual costs for this position are estimated at \$100,000 GPR.

In sum, the ongoing fiscal effect of this bill is estimated to be \$108,400 GPR per year.
