Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Assembly Bill 1002 would create a six member joint legislative Committee on the Oversight of Agency Enforcement to study issues related to the former Government Accountability Board and to report its activities, findings, and any recommendations to the Legislature. The Committee would consist of two majority party members and one minority party member from each house. The bill specifies that the Committee would be required to submit the name of each committee member and staff member to the Department of Justice (DOJ) for a background check to determine if the member is qualified to serve. The bill grants the Committee access to law enforcement investigatory records and John Doe proceeding records to the extent that such records are necessary or convenient to carry out the Committee's powers and duties. The bill grants the Committee subpoena powers as necessary or convenient to carry out its duties and powers. The Committee's subpoena powers to compel the attendance of a person would be enforced by the Department of Administration's Capitol Police. Under the bill, the Committee may request legal, investigational, or reporting assistance from DOJ. The bill specifies that, at the end of two calendar years after the first committee meeting, the Committee be disbanded and DOJ become the custodian of all of the Committee's records.

It would appear that costs associated with creation and operation of the Committee under AB 1002 could be addressed within existing resources of the Legislature.
