#### Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This legislation would have a fiscal impact on the Department of Safety and Professional Services. There would be one-time costs associated with: 1) creating four new credentials in the Integrated Credentialing and Enforcement (ICE) System database; 2) updating the online renewal system; 3) adding the Sign Language Interpreters Examining Board to departmental IT systems; 4) training credentialing staff on the new requirements for licensure; 5) training credentialing staff on the new continuing education requirements; 6) updating the departmental website; 7) drafting administrative rules; 8) purchasing a printer for the creation of identification cards; and, 9) printing initial identification cards for license holders.

Assuming that there would be four meetings of the Sign Language Interpreters Examining Board per year, there would be ongoing costs associated with: 1) departmental personnel prepping for and staffing meetings of the Sign Language Interpreters Examining Board and Memorandum of Understanding Advisory Committee; 2) travel costs and other reimbursable expenses for the Sign Language Interpreters Examining Board and Memorandum of Understanding Advisory Committee; 3) ongoing IT costs related to the Sign Language Interpreters Examining Board and Memorandum of Understanding Advisory Committee; 4) provide interpretive services at meetings of the Sign Language Interpreters Examining Board and Memorandum of Understanding Advisory Committee; and, 5) ongoing costs related to printing identification cards for license holders.

There are potentially increased costs associated with investigations and compliance for the new credentials; however, these costs cannot be determined at this time.
