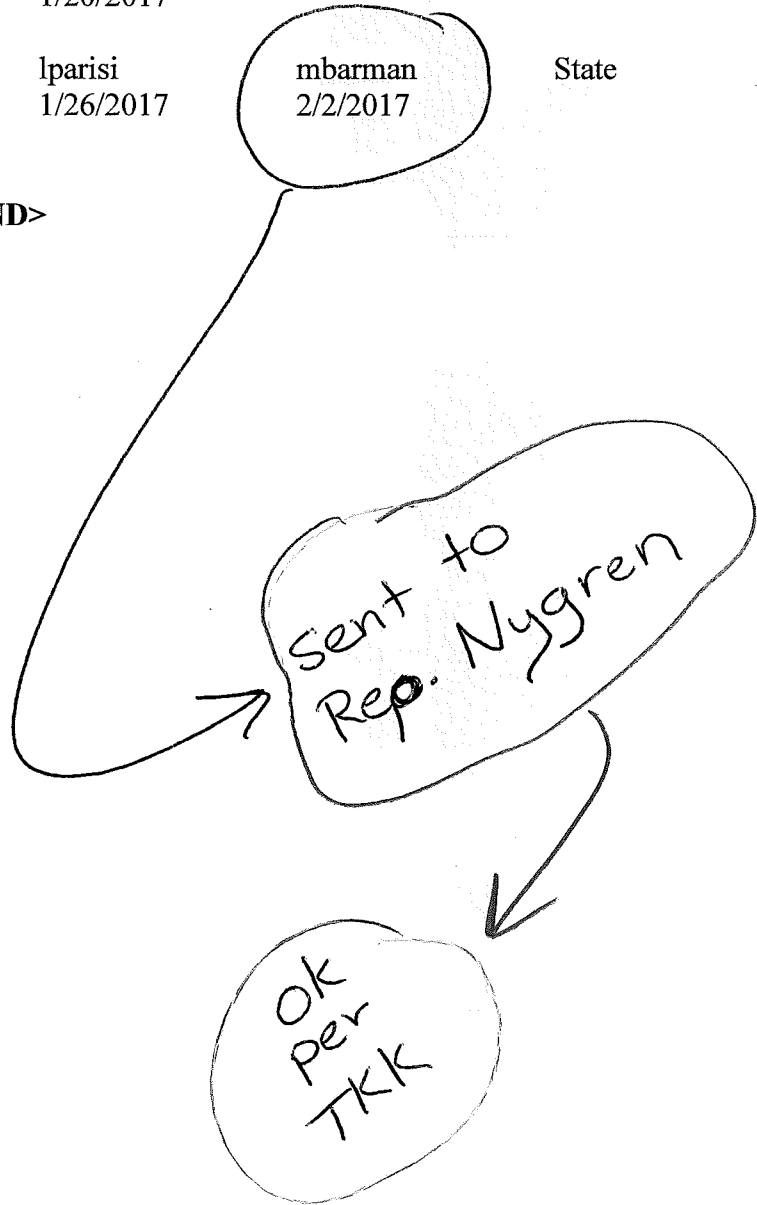

Cathlene, Tracy, and Fern,

These are the requests for the other special session bills, which we are entering as Jr7 special session drafts (CMH, correct me if I'm wrong.) I have the first 3, Cathlene has 4, and either Tracy or Fern has 5. Each is a separate draft for now.

We are entering the requests for the Lieutenant Governor (email to Daniel Suhr) and add a cc: email to Caroline Krause in Rep. Nygren's office.

The fiscal change nonstat is already programmed to change 2017-18 and 2018-19 numbers so I don't believe we need a delayed effective date, but we need to make sure the increase isn't duplicated in the budget. So I recommend adding "This subsection applies only if the appropriation increase in the 2017-19 biennial budget act for this purpose has not occurred." (See 2011 Wisconsin Act 13.) I'm open to suggestions to changing this, but we should probably be consistent.

Tracy and Fern, if you have questions, ask me first as I spoke to Daniel about these.

Hi Tami,

Ryan Hutter from the budget office said you'd be the right person to help with drafting the spending bills for the Special Session on Opioid Abuse that Governor Walker called today. Caroline from the Nygren office has already been working with you on the first six drafts mentioned in the EO, and I'm writing to request the other five. They should all be incredibly short and straightforward.

The first would allocate \$63,000 GPR per year of the 2017-2019 biennium to the rural hospital graduate medical education & training program to support two additional fellowships in addiction medicine.

The second would allocate \$1,000,000 GPR per year of the 2017-2019 biennium for grants to support new medically assisted treatment centers. I think we had previous budget language authorizing money for grants to start the three current MAT Centers that can be a model.

The third would allocate \$500,000 GPR per year of the 2017-2019 biennium for a consultation service for medical professionals to access addiction medicine specialists. We currently fund the Child Psychiatry Consultation Program – I think we want to use that as the model and just substitute in “Addiction Medicine” for Child Psychiatry.

The fourth would allocate \$420,000 GPR per year of the 2017-2019 biennium and four permanent FTE agent positions to the Wisconsin Department of Justice Division of Criminal Investigation to focus on drug interdiction.

The fifth would allocate \$100,000 GPR per year of the 2017-2019 biennium to the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction to expand its Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT) training program – the Department sought \$200,000 GPR/yr in their Sept. 15 request, so that could be a model, just substituting in the lower number.

Does all that make sense? Any immediate questions I can answer? Thanks – DANIEL

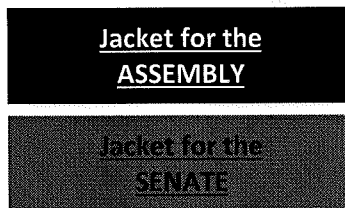
