Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the Department of Justice awards grants to counties to provide alternatives to prosecution and incarceration for criminal offenders who abuse alcohol or other drugs. This bill provides moneys from general purpose revenue in each fiscal year in amounts specified in the bill to increase the amount spent for grants to counties operating treatment and diversion programs, to expand the grant program to more counties, and, subject to approval of the Joint Committee on Finance, to create a pilot program to divert certain persons to treatment options instead of the criminal justice system.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **Section 1.** 20.005 (3) (schedule) of the statutes: at the appropriate place, insert

- 4 Section 2. 20.455 (2) (en) of the statutes is created to read:
 - 20.455 (2) (en) Diversion pilot program. The amounts in the schedule to create a diversion pilot program for nonviolent offenders to be diverted to a treatment option.
 - SECTION 3. 20.455 (2) (en) of the statutes, as created by 2017 Wisconsin Act (this act), is repealed.

SECTION 4. Nonstatutory provisions.

(1) Diversion pilot program. The department of justice shall submit to the joint committee on finance a request to supplement the appropriation under section 20.455 (2) (en) of the statutes with the funds that are held in the appropriation account under section 20.865 (4) (a) of the statutes for the purpose described in Section 5 (3) of this act along with a proposed plan for the expenditure of the moneys. If the cochairpersons of the committee do not notify the department of justice within 14 working days after the date of the department's submittal that the committee has scheduled a meeting for the purpose of reviewing the proposed plan, the joint committee on finance shall release the funds and the department of justice may expend the moneys to implement the proposed plan. If, within 14 working days after the date of the department's submittal, the cochairpersons of the committee notify the department of justice that the committee has scheduled a meeting for the purpose of reviewing the proposed plan, the department of justice may expend the moneys
