Hi Caroline,

Generally, the bill looks good. The issue of all of the funding for the TAD program going to the existing TAD GPR appropriation has been solved.

As we discussed on the phone, the one note I would make is in regards to the funding for the diversion pilot program. Typically, when money is appropriated pending JFC approval, funding is initially placed in JFC's GPR supplemental appropriation [s. 20.865(4)(a)]. If JFC approves DOJ's plan for the diversion pilot program under the 14-day passive review process, the money could be transferred from the JFC appropriation to the new appropriation within DOJ for the diversion pilot program [s. 20.455(2)(en)]. As currently drafted, the bill puts the funding directly in the new appropriation for the diversion pilot program (as opposed to JFC's appropriation). Therefore, I would revise the way the bill is currently drafted to appropriate the \$261,000 GPR annually for the diversion pilot program to JFC's supplemental appropriation [s. 20.865(4)(a)]. Further, Section 3 of the bill would need to be revised to reflect the fact that funding is appropriated to JFC's supplemental appropriation for the diversion pilot program, and that funding may be transferred from the JFC appropriation to the new DOJ appropriation for the diversion pilot program pending a 14-day passive review process.







If the cochairpersons of the committee do not notify the department of justice within 14 working days after the date of the department's submittal that the committee has scheduled a meeting for the purpose of reviewing the proposed plan, the joint committee on finance shall (transfer) the funds to the appropriation account under section 20.455 (2) (kf) of the statutes and the department of justice may expend the moneys to implement the proposed plan. If, within 14 working days after the date of the department's submittal, the cochairpersons of the committee notify the department of justice that the committee has scheduled a meeting for the purpose of reviewing the proposed plan, the department of justice may expend the moneys only if the joint committee on finance transfers the funds to the appropriation account under section 20.455 (2) (kf) of the statutes and only to implement the plan as approved by the committee.

### SECTION 3. Fiscal changes.

(1) Treatment and diversion program grants. In the schedule under section 20.005 (3) of the statutes for the appropriation to the department of justice under section 20.455 (2) (em) of the statutes, the dollar amount for fiscal year 2017–18 is increased by \$2,000,000 for the purpose for which the appropriation is made. ## **BILL**

AN ACT to create 20.455 (2) (en) of the statutes; relating to: treatment and

diversion programs and making appropriations.

### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the Department of Justice awards grants to counties to provide alternatives to prosecution and incarceration for criminal offenders who abuse alcohol or other drugs. This bill provides moneys from general purpose revenue in each fiscal year in amounts specified in the bill to increase the amount spent for grants to counties operating treatment and diversion programs, to expand the grant program to more counties, and, subject to review of the Joint Committee on Finance, to create a pilot program to divert certain persons to treatment options instead of the criminal justice system.

20.455 (2) (en) *Diversion pilot program*. The amounts in the schedule to create a diversion pilot program for nonviolent offenders to be diverted to a treatment option.

#### SECTION 3. Nonstatutory provisions.

(1) Diversion pilot program. Before the department of justice expends the moneys described in Section 4 (3) of this act from the appropriation under section 20.455 (2) (en) of the statutes, the department of justice shall submit to the joint committee on finance a proposed plan for the expenditure of those moneys to create a diversion pilot program for nonviolent offenders to be diverted to a treatment option. If the cochairpersons of the committee do not notify the department of justice within 14 working days after the date of the department's submittal that the committee has scheduled a meeting for the purpose of reviewing the proposed plan, the department of justice may expend the moneys to implement the proposed plan. If, within 14 working days after the date of the department of justice's submittal, the cochairpersons of the committee notify the department of justice that the committee has scheduled a meeting for the purpose of reviewing the proposed plan, the department of justice may expend the moneys described in Section 4 (3) of this act only on approval of the committee.
