Hi Cathlene,

Sen. Johnson would like a bill drafted that creates a "Gold Alert" system similar to the "Amber" and "Silver" alerts. The Gold Alert would be for missing at-risk veterans, and the criteria for an alert would be:

- 1) Veteran or active-duty member of armed forces
- 2) They are believed to have PTSD, Traumatic Brain Injury, or other service-related physical or mental health condition
- 3) There is a reasonable believe that the missing person's disappearance is due to their service-related physical or mental health condition
- 4) The request is made within 72 hours of the individual's disappearance

Sen. Johnson would also like to codify that a missing veteran or active duty member of the military with a service-related physical or mental health condition shall be deemed as a critically missing adult by law enforcement within 72 hours of the individual's disappearance.


