Rep. Milroy would like to have a bill drafted that would allow terminally ill individuals who are participating in an event sponsored by a charitable organization to qualify as residents for purposes of purchasing a hunting license. A similar law was enacted in Texas in 2013.

I know you don't need to know this, but the bill is at the request of Brigid O'Donoghue, CEO and Founder of United Special Sportsman Alliance. She does amazing work with disabled and terminally ill individuals. If you're interested, check out her website at www.childwish.org. She works to fulfill the wishes of terminally ill people at no cost to them. Saving money by charging a resident fee rather than non-resident would save money to be used for transportation/hotel, etc.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill requires the Department of Natural Resources to treat a terminally ill individual who is participating in a hunting-related event sponsored by a charitable organization as a resident for purposes of determining his or her eligibility for, and cost of, obtaining hunting approvals. Under current law, fees charged for hunting, trapping, and fishing approvals are lower for approvals issued to residents than for those issued to nonresidents.

For further information see the ***state and local*** fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- 3 SECTION 1. 29.194 (1) (d) of the statutes is created to read:

3 is described in section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue code and that is exempt from
4 taxation under section 501 (a) of the Internal Revenue code.

****NOTE: This mirrors the language of s. 29.194 (1) (b), which does something similar for certain veterans and members of the military. It covers all hunting approvals except a conservation patron license, which confers a combination of a number of hunting and fishing licenses. Okay?

****NOTE: Is a "charitable organization" described appropriately?

****NOTE: This leaves it to DNR to determine what proof is necessary to show that a person is terminally ill and participating in the event. Let me know if you would like to specify this in more detail.
