Hi Aaron,

I'd say \$250k/FY.

Here are some additional guidelines for you:

The Department of Health Services shall make an annual grant of \$250,000, beginning in the second year of the 2017-19 biennium and continuing in subsequent biennia, to the University of Wisconsin School of Nursing to support the Graduate Psychiatric-Mental Health Program. The Program shall use the funds for the following purposes: expanding the number of students studying to become Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioners, provided that students benefiting from these funds must commit to passing board certification and to practicing in Wisconsin for at least two years after graduation; expanding the instructional capacity available to teach students studying to become Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioners; and to provide fellowships to students participating in clinical rotations in underserved or rural communities in Wisconsin.
