Motion:

Move to provide \$539,300 SEG in fiscal year 2017-18 and \$719,000 SEG in fiscal year 2018-19 from the Veterans Trust Fund and 7.0 FTE SEG two-year project positions, expiring on June 30, 2019 to expand the veterans outreach and recovery program from 49 to 65 counties.

Under current law, the department is required to administer a veterans assistance program to provide persons who served in the U.S. armed forces, or in forces incorporated as part of the U.S. armed forces and who were discharged under conditions other than dishonorable. Specify that the department shall also operate a veterans assistance program for persons with a mental health condition for persons who served in the U.S. armed forces, in forces incorporated as part of the U.S. armed forces, or persons who serve or who have served in a reserve component of the U.S. armed forces or the National Guard, and who were discharged under conditions other than dishonorable.

Beginning December 30, 2017 and quarterly there-after, require DVA to prepare a report to the Governor and the Joint Committee on Finance detailing: (a) the number of veterans served and the services provided to veterans under this program; (b) the types of insurance veterans indicate having at the time of contact; and (c) the status of the expansion to the 16 additional counties. Further, require the department, as part of its report due December 30, 2018, to include a recommendation regarding the future of the program including the following: (a) whether to continue the program and extension of the project positions and funding; (b) any further expansion of the program beyond the initial 65 counties; and (c) all administrative expenses for the program.

Note:

The veterans outreach and recovery program was established as a joint effort between the Department of Health Services and the Department of Veterans Affairs to provide coordinated outreach, treatment and support for veterans who are homeless who have a behavioral health disorder. The program was funded through a three-year period with federal grants from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration. The grant money was used to support 8.0 FTE project positions. This motion would provide SEG expenditure authority and project positions to expand the program from the current 49 counties to a total of 65 counties. The department indicates that, if approved, the program will be further supported by reallocating existing staff positions.


