Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The bill prohibits DNR from requiring any appraisal or charging any fee prior to granting an easement for the construction of broadband infrastructure in underserved areas.

Assumptions made for Bill language:

- 1. Fee for Easement DNR will be prohibited from receiving any compensation for broadband easement on DNR owned lands.
- 2. Broadband Easement This is a utility requiring easement for telecommunication infrastructure (wire and wireless) and precludes other utilities such as power distribution.
- 3. Broadband This is an internet access speed (upload and download) of less than 3Mbps.
- 4. Underserved areas Underserved areas are not delineated in the bill; this analysis makes no assumptions of this definition.

Fiscal Impact:

The bill will decrease DNR revenue received through conveyed easement. The estimated decrease in revenue cannot be fully determined since the areas of the State that are considered underserved (and associated DNR owned lands in those areas) are not delineated in the bill.

Historical Analysis:

Over the last 10 years the DNR has conveyed approximately 53 easements to 20 different telecommunication providers (companies) on DNR owned lands statewide. These easements are provided to telecommunication providers if the requested easement does not impact planned development on the property. Total acreage conveyed under these easements over the last 10 years is 34 acres with total revenues received of \$131,088.
