Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law, the mayor of a city may call a special meeting of the common council by written notice delivered personally to each member or left at the member's usual abode at least six hours before the meeting.

2017 AB 145 proposes that the mayor may call a special meeting by notifying members in a manner likely to give each member notice of the meeting and providing the notice at least six hours before the meeting.

This bill would result in savings in an amount equal to the difference in cost between personal delivery of a message and the manner likely to give each member notification. The provisions of the bill don't provide for the method of notification and data is not readily available to estimate the frequency of special meetings or the number of council member notifications; therefore, the local fiscal impact is indeterminate.
