Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The State Public Defender (SPD) is statutorily authorized and required to appoint attorneys to represent indigent defendants in criminal and certain commitment proceedings. The SPD plays a critical role in ensuring that the Wisconsin justice system complies with the right to counsel provided by both the state and federal constitutions. Any legislation has the potential to increase SPD costs if it creates a new criminal offense, expands the definition of an existing criminal offense, or increases the penalties for an existing offense.

This bill would create a state prosecutors office, and would also create an independent prosecutor board that oversees and sets policies for the state prosecutors office.

The bill requires that if a proposed administrative rule affects the state prosecutors office that the agency preparing the rule must submit the rule to the office for the purpose of preparing a report prior to the rule being submitted to Legislative Council. The bill allows the state prosecutors office to request information from other agencies to complete the report.

SPD cannot estimate how often it may receive information requests under this provision, but does not anticipate a significant need for additional staff resources as a result.
