Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

- I. Bureau of Watershed Management--Dams & Floodplains
- A. Local Fiscal Effect
- 1. Revenues

The bill would decrease revenue by an indeterminate amount for counties, cities and villages by not allowing local units of government to charge a fee for processing a floodplain permit for activities, including land disturbance and fill, in mapped floodplains within the community.

2. Costs

The bill could potentially have an indeterminate fiscal impact on the 500 counties, cities and villages in Wisconsin participating in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) if FEMA determines it does not comply with NFIP standards.

B. State Fiscal Effect

As a National Floodplain Insurance Program partner, Department floodplain policy and field staff would need to work with FEMA on the consequences of the statutory changes. These costs are indeterminate.

II. Bureau of Watershed Management--Waterway and Wetland Permitting

The bill establishes permit exemptions for removal of material from the bed of a ditch operated by the drainage district and for discharge to a wetland that is the result of an activity undertaken by a drainage district to maintain a district drain in accordance with plans and specifications approved by the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP).

A. Costs

The Department would incur a one-time workload increase related to updating program procedures and databases, revising application and exemption materials, legal review of documents, rule promulgation, training staff, and conducting customer outreach. Workload increases are estimated at \$62,800 and 0.75 FTE of staff time.

B. Revenues

The waterway and wetland permit exemptions in the bill would result in an estimated \$4,300/year reduction in permit fee revenue.
