Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

DOT refers nearly all cases of lost or stolen firearms they receive to local authorities. There is no fiscal effect on DOT.

This bill would require that a person who owns a firearm that is lost or stolen to report this theft or loss within 24 hours of discovering the theft or loss. This bill would then require a local law enforcement agency to expend an additional 15 minutes per case producing the file specified in s. 175.36 (2) (b) 1., Stats, as created by this bill, by working with an owner who is not currently compelled to report the theft or loss of a firearm to gather the information that this subdivision specifies. The annual number of additional firearms that owners would report lost or stolen annually due to these reporting requirements is unknown. We assume that local agencies would incur no cost through the electronic filing of reports with DOJ. There is an indeterminate increase in costs for local law enforcement agencies.
