#### Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Assembly Bill 880 proposes: (a) prohibiting courts from granting any deference to a state agency's experience, technical competence or specialized knowledge; (b) requiring agencies to meet new publication and public comment requirements for guidance issued by agencies in the future; and (c) clarifying that settlement agreements, consent decrees and court orders do not provide authority to an agency to promulgate rules. Regarding existing guidance documents, the legislation requires that by July 1, 2018 agencies either certify that the guidance meets the requirements of the bill or the guidance must follow the publication requirements of the bill.

#### Fiscal Effect

- 1. Increased costs for the DNR are anticipated under the bill's new requirement for all agencies issuing guidance to follow specific publication and public comment procedures.
- 2. Additionally, the requirement that courts grant no deference to agencies could lead to increased litigation in the future, which would further increase costs for the DNR.
- 3. The bill could also lead the DNR to increasingly engage outside experts during litigation, which would also increase costs.
